Easter Friendly Activities For Autistic Children

Making Egg hunt Autism Friendly

As we know, Easter celebration comes with a tradition of the egg hunt which is called "Easter egg hunt". This can be a challenging activity for children on the spectrum. This is because it involves multiple things that it can represent. There are ways to make your child participate and fun in the tradition. To achieve this, you must prepare in advance to ease stress and for easy practice. Here are some tips.

Before the hunt:

- Practice at home with few friends and neighbors to get it just right
- Visit the event place in advance with your child to make he/she familiar with the environment.

The day of hunt:

- Arrive before the event start to avoid crowds and also to explain to your child once again.
- Make sure you are prepared by bringing headphones to protect your child from the noise of other children if required.
- Bring all needed items like basket especially the ones used to practice at home.
- Explain to other parents and children about your child situation and needs to avoid lots of pushing and rushing.
- Stay with your child and grab his/her hand, if necessary, when going for the activity
- Also inform your child that it is okay to do things at his/her pace.
- Be festive by dressing along with the party.

Raymond Babbitt

Raymond Babbitt is a man with Autism and Savant syndrome. He is played by Dustin Hoffman in 1988's "Rainman" A New feature, where we examine fictional representations of autistic people.

which was a well-received depiction of autism. Babbitt is someone who adheres to strict routines, ritualistic behaviour, demonstrates little emotional expression, and has marked impairments in the use of nonverbal behaviours. He also has superb memory recall. While the character has been celebrated for making autism more prominent in the public consciousness, he has also had a mixed reception. Audience have praised the depiction given by Dustin Hoffman, generally agreed to be accurate and sensitive. However, the film and character has been criticised for suggesting that autism and savant skills always co-exist (in reality this is very rare), leading to the belief that all autistic people have unusual abilities.

Autistic Children Communicating Their Personality Using Artwork

A touring art exhibition is giving young people who are autistic an opportunity to express themselves. This exhibition is being held in the Flowefield Art center in Portstewart, county Londonderry. The exhibition is about what Autism means and it showcases more than 140 pieces of art created by autistic post-primary pupils from schools across Northern Ireland. Each pupil artwork is personalized by communicating what their individual artwork means to them. One of the pupils whose name is Molly attached a quote to her artwork saying "Autism makes us unique in ways people aren't able to see and it makes us better people". Another of the pupils whose name is Emma said her artwork was about highlighting the many positives associated with being Autistic. Our activity centre in Thornton Heath is open throughout the year, Except on Bank Holidays.


The Bridge SEN School admits students all through the academic year between the ages of 14-25. If you are interested in placing a student at the school or obtaining more information, please contact administratives.
